Updates on the work of the Parish Council

Fernwood Parish Council

Welcome to the Autumn issue of the Fernwood Gazette. Below, I give a brief update on the current work of the Parish Council:

The Parish Council is continuing to work with Nottinghamshire County Council (NCC) regarding road safety on the B6326. The interactive speed sign was installed in August and we are due to meet with NCC to see what can be done to improve safety for those pedestrians and cyclists crossing near the Tawny Owl.

Legal work for the Parish Council's purchase of the woodland behind the nursery is underway. This has not progressed as quickly as we would have liked but, we wanted to let you know the Parish Council is committed to buying this land, tidying it up and making it better for residents, whilst looking after the wildlife there. We will be in touch with everyone that expressed an interest in helping with this area as soon as the land ours.

Legal work for the transfer of ownership of the village hall from Newark and Sherwood District Council to Fernwood Parish Council is still ongoing. We hope to get this finalised very soon.

Earlier this year, Barratt David Wilson Homes agreed they would transfer ownership of their open spaces in Fernwood Central to Newark and Sherwood District Council who would in turn transfer them to the Parish Council. We are still awaiting the legal documentation on this. This would not mean we would not have a management company looking after central Fernwood but it would make things easier to improve what is on offer in our village.

We continue to hold regular liaison meetings with Barratt David Wilson Homes (BDWH). The construction traffic coming through the village has picked up over the last couple of months so we have asked planning enforcement and Via East Midlands what can be done. Via have asked BDWH to look at reviewing the signage as it is not fit for purpose and planning enforcement have asked BDWH to tackle this problem so we hope to see some improvement. Larkfleet have also begun their infrastructure work for the 350 homes that they have planned for Fernwood so we will be meeting with them too.

Don't Bottle It

Some of you have noticed that our excellent Bottle Bank has become more popular since lockdown. With less of us drinking out, maybe more are downing the odd wee dram at home. This has meant that the bank has been filling up quickly and despite the best efforts of the company that empties the Banks, occasionally they become full. Apparently all Banks are filling up more quickly and the company that empties them has a limited number of drivers so instant emptying is not possible. To help, as there is a clothes bank at the Tawny Owl car park and next to the Onestop Shop, the possibility of swapping the clothes bank that is in the area with the Bottle banks with an additional Bottle bank is being examined.



WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP?

When the Banks are FULL please don't leave your bottles by the Bank. They can get smashed, cause danger for others and may cost us to get cleared up. Only the Banks are emptied and bottles not in the Banks are left. Please take your bottles home and wait until the bank has been emptied.

If you are leaving a lot of bottles, as our Bank is small, please help your neighbours and take them to the tip.

When you visit the Bank and it is starting to look full, say within 30cm (12 inches) of the top, please phone the number on the Bank and tell them so that they can empty them as soon as
