Dog Waste Bins

The Parish Council owns all the dog waste bins in central Fernwood.

Newark and Sherwood District Council are contracted to empty the bins on behalf of the Parish Council.

All bins are emptied every Tuesday. There is second collection each week on the bins on Dale Way, Apple Avenue and Restfil Way/ Camdale Lane on a Friday.

We make regular checks on the bins to maintain them; if you spot an issue, please contact the Parish Council office and we will get it rectified.

Fernwood Parish Council owns and maintains four grit bins in the village. These are blue and are located on the following streets:

Housing Developments in and around Fernwood

There are three developers building or planning to build houses on the edges of our village. The planning references are as follows if you want to look these up on the Newark and Sherwood District Council website:



Work on the Barratt David Wilson Homes (BDWH) site started last year and we should see new homes being occupied in the first quarter of 2020. The Parish Council are in close liaison with the developers to try to minimise disruption to Fernwood Residents.

There are conditions within their planning permission which ensure construction traffic should not be coming through the village.

We are keeping a log of issues so please contact the Parish Council office if you see any problems.

Fernwood Parish Council are pleased to confirm, that in line with its five year strategy, that there will not be a management company maintaining the open spaces in the new BDWH development.



Report it

Community Urged to Report Bad Behaviour

Newark and Sherwood District Council Public Protection, the Police and Fernwood Parish Council have joined forces to relaunch the Fernwood Report It Campaign. The idea of the campaign is to advertise the appropriate route to address problems such as noise, rowdy behaviour and other such nuisance. The initiative has proven successful in other areas and it will be spearheaded locally by Fernwood Parish Council working in partnership with other agencies such as the District Council and Police.

Terry Bailey, Anti-Social Behaviour Officer said "We feel it is important that residents feel safe and secure in their homes and communities. Residents should feel confident that when they report matters to the appropriate agencies that something can and will be done. The more information provided by residents such as times and dates and descriptions the more chance that agencies have at placing the appropriate resources in place to help solve the problem. PCSO Sophie Patterson-Lees, part of the Fernwood Beat Team stated that "We work closely with agencies to try and resolve matters for the community. Residents should report incidents to our 101 number if the nuisance has already happened and 999 while a crime is in progress. We really want residents to become engaged in this initiative and let us know if nuisance exists on the area". Fernwood Parish Chairman, Barry Smith, said "Fernwood Parish Council encourages residents to call the Police when they come across anti-social behaviour. There are often discussions on social media but this is not reflected in the figures the Police and the District Council Public Protection Team have for Fernwood. To tackle these issues, we need to inform the Police or District Council Public Protection Team; social media will not resolve it"

About Parish Council Meetings

- 1. The Full Council meets on the third Monday of each month here at the village hall (apart from August and December when we don't meet).
- 2. The Planning and Strategy Committee meet on the first Monday of each month here at the village hall (apart from August and December).
- 3. These meetings are open to the public so you can see the work of the Parish Council.
- 4. At the beginning of every meeting we hold a public forum where you can raise issues with the Councillors.
- 5. Agendas are published approximately a week before the meetings.
- 6. Draft minutes are usually published a week after the meeting but are not formally agreed until the next meeting.
- 7. All minutes and the latest agenda can be found on our noticeboards and on our website: <u>www.fernwood-pc.co.uk</u>
- 8. Often there is a District or County Councillor present at our meetings so if you have any issues about their services, you could raise it with them.
- 9. Occasionally there is a confidential item on the agenda where observers need to leave the room.

Your Parish Council

The Parish Council has three main assets in the village: the village hall, the green on Dale Crescent and the dog waste bins. The Council want to take ownership of the open spaces in Fernwood but Barratt David Wilson Homes do not want to hand over the land at this time. We are seeking help from Newark and Sherwood District Council and our local MP to achieve this.

The Parish Council is consulted by local planning authorities on plans in and around the Parish and it liaises with other local councils and developers and businesses involved with the village.

The Parish Council has met with our local MP to lobby the government for better rights for freeholders living in villages with management companies.
